



Dear Friends,

'For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him' John 3: 16-17

November is a month for remembering. 1 November is All Souls Day when all around the world people in varying ways think about their loved ones who have died. Many nationalities use All Souls' Day as an opportunity to visit the graves of their loved ones, and the graveyards in Eastern Europe are covered with the tiny twinkling lights of hundreds of candles.

In India, people take wreaths of bright flowers and the graveyards become places of beauty and colour, as they remember and celebrate with joy the lives of those buried there. And in the countries around the Baltic Sea, families actually take picnics to the graves, so that the deceased can be included in a family party as their relatives remember their place and their legacy within that family.

In our churches we also hold services on the nearest Sunday to this. This year we have already done this. On 29 October we came together to think about those we love but see no longer, and



lit a candle in their memory as people do quite often when they want to remember loved ones at any time of the year.

Then on 11 November we have Remembrance Day, and on a Sunday close to that we hold our Remembrance Services in our churches and at war memorials. This is a time for remembering the sacrifice of many throughout the ages, in many different conflicts, who have given their lives so that we might live in peace. Those known to us by name and those whose names we will never know.

I am thankful God has made us with the capacity to remember. When we think of good times, funny times, experiences and even bad times we celebrate the lives of those we love. And in our churches, each time we celebrate Holy Communion, we remember that God gave his Son, Jesus, to die in love for each one of us and offer us forgiveness and eternal life. What better way to remember God's love for us.

Tree Warden Wanted for Ashton Keynes. Wiltshire & Swindon Tree Warden Scheme

Wiltshire Council's Woodland Grant Application and Planting Support (GAPS) Team, wish to relaunch a Tree Warden Scheme in association with The Tree Council and are looking for a Tree Warden for every Parish.

What will Tree Wardens do?

The Tree Wardens will be able to assist the GAPS Teams with as many of these roles as they feel able:

- Act as a contact and support for tree related matters in their local area
- Identify areas in the community for local tree and woodland planting.
- Protect trees by reporting early signs of pests, disease and vandalism.
- Gather, survey and record information about trees important for wildlife or heritage.
- Get involved in campaigns to raise awareness about the importance of trees.
- With support from GAPS Officers apply for planting grant funding for community projects.
- Co-ordinate local volunteers to manage community tree and woodland planting.
- Set up tree nurseries using seeds collected locally.
- Work with local groups and schools support The Tree Council's school orchard programme and Young Tree Champions.
- Lead guided tree walks and give talks to local groups.
- Spearhead Tree Council initiatives and campaigns throughout the year.
- Work with local landowners to identify areas for tree, woodland or hedgerow planting or assist with laying hedges or tagging hedge trees for protection.

Parish Council

While the Tree Wardens will be working under the auspices of the local Town or Parish Council the GAPS Team will support with training, coordination, and advice.

Tree Wardens will not adjudicate in local disputes regarding trees, undertake major tree works use machinery or chemicals, work from height, or make any judgements about tree safety. This remains the remit of professional tree experts. The GAPS Tree Warden Scheme is primarily about the proactive facilitating of tree and woodland planting at the community level to meet Council biodiversity and climate targets. It does not replace any of the existing Council structures for dealing with existing tree issues and these enquiries should still be referred to either the Highways or Estates teams through the appropriate channels.

New applications considered, for which there were 'No Objections'

Derryfield Cottage, Derryfields: T1-7 Poplar – pollard to previous points. T8 Ash – remove dead limbs and lower branches to lift crown, T9 Sycamore (self seeded) – fell, T10 Lime – reduce to previous pollard points.

Chestnuts, Back Street: Erection of a front porch. Chestnuts, Back Street: Proposed Outbuilding. Dairy Farm Quarry, Ashton Road: Variation of condition 1 of 19/07127/WCM to retain the concrete batching plant for a further two years to 31 December 2026.

Dairy Farm Quarry, Ashton Road: Variation of condition 1 of 19/06818/WCM to retain the aggregate recycling operation for a further two year period to December 2026.

Applications determined by Wiltshire Council, 'No objections'

Holy Cross Church, North End: Fell large leaf lime. Mill House, 7 Church Walk: Ash tree near rear of house, on riverbank. Tree is showing signs of ash die-back – propels is to reduce it in height by one third to a half to remove affected areas. If during height reduction it becomes apparent that tree is unsalvageable, to remove tree entirely.

6 Park Place: Silver Birch tree – prune back branches to clear overhead cables.

27 Park Place: T 1 Plum tree - Reduce overall crown size by 30%. T2 Cherry tree - Reduce overall crown size by 30%. T3 Cherry Plum tree - Fell to ground level. T4 Cherry tree - Reduce the overall crown size by 40%. T5 Cotoneaster tree - Reduce overall crown size by 20%.

Bulbs Galore

As reported in previous editions of the Newsletter, the Millennium Green Trustees have embarked on a project to create a bluebell wood on the Millennium Green. 4,000 bulbs were planted last Autumn in a patch of the larger copse and produced a good show in April/ May this year. On the back of this success the Trustees embarked on extensive fund-raising which resulted in a further 22,500 bulbs being bought and delivered to Ashton Keynes on 4 October. Our thanks go to the Parish Council, Ashton Keynes Charity, FoAKS, Conservation Volunteers, The National Garden Scheme, and Vivienne and David Moss for their support.

With help from 12 village volunteers, 20,000 bulbs were planted by the Trustees on 8 October. The bluebells were planted in 'patches' where an additional 5 patches were created in the larger copse, and a patch in the smaller copse planted in memory of Vivienne Moss, a Trustee of the Green since its inception and a driving force in its development, who died earlier this year.

Each 'patch' contains some 3,500 bulbs in an area of 16 sq m. This is the recommended planting density to achieve a bluebell 'blue carpet' effect. Furthermore, as bluebell bulbs only commence flowering at 5 years of age, 4 year old bulbs were purchased of the native English bluebell Hyacinthoides Non-scripta. So while we hope this should guarantee a good display next Spring, it should be even better for the Green's Silver Anniversary in 2025. And, as the bluebells naturalise and spread, there should be a magnificent display in 2050 as you waltz around the Ashton Keynes Bluebell Wood with your (great?) grandchildren. As this is a 'heritage' project, it is good news that the School has agreed to become involved where Year 6 will plant a further 2,500 bulbs in a patch in the smaller copse next month.

Trustees will continue to seek funding on an opportunistic basis over the coming year. Any villagers wishing to contribute to the purchase of further bulbs, or even sponsor their own 'family legacy' patch at a cost of £350, should contact the Millennium Green Treasurer, Steve Page at steve.jspage@gmail.com



Starring Jim Broadbent, Penelope Wilton, Earl Cave, Linda Bassett and many others


"If we don't go mad once in a while, there's no hope" – Rachel Joyce (the author of the book)

Based on her best-selling book, Rachel Joyce also adapted it for the screen. This film is the most popular of all Rural Cinema screening in the South between now and the end of 2023.

The compelling story of Harold Fry's 500 mile walk from Devon to the English border with Scotland is well translated to the big screen. When retired Brewery manager Harold (Jim Broadbent) receives a letter from an old work colleague that she is dying in a hospice at the other end of the country (Berwick-upon-Tweed),

he writes a letter. However, feeling it is not enough, he cannot bring himself to post it and decides to walk to see her, leaving his wife Maureen (Penelope Wilton) sick with worry and frantic about being on her own. As Harold makes his way up north his 'Pilgrimage' starts to become public knowledge and becomes headline news. During this journey, we start to learn that his life and relationship with Maureen is not as boring as it seems, for beneath the surface he is masking a terrible tragedy and a fractured relationship. 
Wiltshire Air Ambulance



Enjoying a more ethical chocolate bar

During autumn and winter, we typically eat more chocolate. I've been reading a bit about the history of this confection and discovered that Europe eats more chocolate than anywhere else, actually between 45%–55% of the world's supply, followed by the US at 18%. Europe therefore eats most of the profit too, despite the fact we can't even grow cocoa here.


The majority of the world's cocoa is grown by small farmers in West Africa, where it's the source of livelihood for millions of people. But cocoa farmers receive barely any of the chocolate industry's \$100 billion revenue: estimates range between 6% and 11%.

EthicalConsumer.org has carried out extensive research into the chocolate industry and ranked 45 brands. I have included their summary flowchart and named a few brands to avoid. The brands are rated on areas such as carbon emissions, use of palm oil, human rights, animal rights and tax conduct.

If you want to eat chocolate, but don't want to support unfair and unsustainable practices, this flowchart helps you find ethical brands which suit your wallet and your chocolate demands. The flowchart features recommended brands on price and ethics. Using example, 100g bars from company websites. Brands to avoid are Mondelez (who own Cadbury), Nestle and Mars.

16 December – Nativity – By popular demand, the gorgeous knitted nativity scene will be in the Telephone Gallery again.



- all children aged 2 or 3 years on 31 August 2023
- primary school aged children (from Reception to Year 6)
- those in long-stay residential care homes
- carers in receipt of carer's allowance, or those who are the main carer of an elderly or disabled person
- close contacts of immunocompromised individuals


