


Dear Friends,

I heard an interview with a Rabbi on the radio, and he was speaking about his response to the war in Israel/Gaza; he was a peacemaker. His response was – wherever we are, we are to be a blessing, this is how blessing spreads. So, he went on, wherever we are we are, to make peace, live peace, spread peace.

Maybe this Christmas and New Year we can resolve to live in peace and kindness, careful about how we respond to people, careful how we speak of people and to people, bringing the Prince of Peace into our hearts and homes, so that we can live in the peace of Emmanuel, God with us, and share that peace with others.

What do Local Councils do?

Your local parish council work falls into three main categories:

- Delivery of services
- Improve quality of life for residents
- Give communities a democratic voice

Becoming a Local Councillor

As a local councillor you can become a voice for your community and make real change. Local councillors are the champions of their community who invest time in local projects and issues to the benefit of residents and the neighbourhood.

Local councillor responsibilities fall into three main categories:

- Decision-making
- Monitoring
- Getting involved locally

Can I apply for Co-option?

To join a local council you must be:

- A UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland; or be a citizen of another Member State of the European Union
- At least 18 years old
- An elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary.


The Magic, The Joy, this December celebrate the untold story of an icon.

AK Primary School





Year 5 has been




Shackleton so that we can create biographies about him.

In Year 4, in Science, we have started the year by learning about skeletons. We have learned the names and functions of some of



the key bones in our bodies and those of animals and drawn some comparisons between different skeletons as well as learning about exoskeletons.



We then took an in depth study in to one of our focus scientists, Wilhelm Rontgen, the man who discovered X-Rays! We found out all about him (including the fact he was expelled from school!) and wrote our own fact files.

Umbrella Project Display on the Hall Ceiling

We are so excited have purchased the neurodiversity umbrella display and now have it installed in our school hall.



As a school we are proud to promote diversity and celebrate how we are all individual and uniquely made but part of an important family. We should embrace and celebrate our uniqueness and individuality and this includes the way our amazing brains work, so that we can be kind, supportive and inclusive. Here is the context around the umbrellas and what they represent. I saw them in Cardiff last year and then one of my parents brought the idea to me and her son presented to the whole school on autism to raise awareness.

The Neurodiversity Umbrella Project is an uplifting visual representation of all the different minds we have here in the UK. Every Umbrella Project installation helps to

raise awareness and understanding of neurodiversity. Thousands of colourful umbrellas are strung together over public spaces, in schools, and in company buildings around the nation. Each display is designed to represent the one in five of us who have a neurodevelopmental condition, such as ADHD, Autism, Dyslexia, Dyspraxia, Dyscalculia or Tourette's syndrome. These conditions fall under the umbrella term of neurodiversity.

We are changing the perception of neurodiverse/neurodivergent people and celebrating all the many strengths that come from thinking differently.

I hope you enjoy the display and all it signifies for our wonderful school by supporting our vision that every child deserves 'life in all its fullness' and embracing and celebrating diversity in all areas of life is a very important part of how we go about achieving this vision.



We are looking into the issues. I do know that the police have been making visits to the area in recent weeks.

October saw extremes in weather with the area being hit by a large amount of rainfall over several days. There were properties in the village that were flooded and as a Parish Council we are sorry to hear this.

We will be raising the issues with the County Council but we would like to remind landowners that watercourses are designed to aid the flow of water, and it is their responsibility to keep them clear and flowing.

It is also the time of year to get road side hedges cut to improve visibility for road users.



Moos on the Thames

Most of the cows are now housed for winter. The milking cows are in full time. They get fed silage twice a day; this is to copy the rumen cycles of when they are out grazing getting two fresh areas of grass a day. Even with the wet weather carrying on into the autumn, we managed to keep grazing into November so we are in a good place with silage stocks. We have had thirty acres flooded for a month now. And with the rain continuing to fall I don't see the floods going down anytime soon. We will have to see in the spring how much damage has been done the those fields. But I am expecting to have to reseed some of it, even if it's just broadcasting on some seed and letting the cows trample it in to get some productivity out of those fields.



The spring born calves that have been out grazing all summer have now returned home and are in a shed. These are getting grass silage and some fodder beets (a big root crop a bit like a swede) to give them some extra energy to help them grow. The in-calf heifers that will calve in March are still out bale grazing. They get a daily allocation of grass and silage bales that I put in place in the summer. They will be housed in the new year so they can get used to the cubicles.

I will start to dry off (stop milking) some of the milking cows in December. This is where they have a two month break from milking. Most of the cows will be dried off in December and January. But don't worry there will still be plenty of milk in the vending machine over the winter. This is why I created a small summer calving group that I can milk through the winter. The economics of producing milk greatly increases over winter with the added feeding, bedding and machinery costs. Nothing compares to the quality of grazed grass through the growing season.

In vending machine news, we now have organic herd chocolate bars in the machine alongside the organic herd drinking chocolate flakes and mature and extra mature cheddars. We have also had a software update on the milk vending machine which has stream lined the process. We will be having more updates within the next few weeks.



Caring for our world

Walking in the fresh air and listening to podcasts



One of my favourite pastimes is walking, and usually if I'm on my own, I listen to podcasts. Some philosophical, some informative, some spiritual. I know I'm not alone in my concern about the future of our planet, and I find that listening to podcasts that focus on progress and positivity in tackling climate change, addresses the feeling of helplessness that can easily overwhelm.

The podcast **Outrage and Optimism**, is hosted by the most excellent Christiana Figueres (the architect of the 2015 Paris Climate agreement) ably assisted by Tom Rivett-Carnac (a political strategist) and Paul Dickinson (founder of the Carbon Disclosure Project). They analyse and

distil, for a lay individual like me, some very complex geopolitical developments in the climate arena. As the title suggests, there is outrage, usually at governmental and regulatory in-action, but equally there is always cause for optimism. Each episode usually features a conversation with a leading voice in the field, followed by an engaging discussion. It is a brilliant podcast (globaloptoimism.com).

Another one that always uplifts me is **The Way Out Is In.** A beautiful listen from Plum Village, a buddhist monastery in the south of France. It was established by Zen Master Thich Nhat Hanh, when he was exiled from his home during the Vietnam war for daring to promote peace. Plum Village is all about engaged buddhism and the podcast gets it's teeth into thorny world issues, like climate, and tackles them head on with compassion, deep listening and understanding. It's a wonderful antidote to shouty sound bite politics! The Way Out Is In is hosted by the monastry's abbot, and sometimes fabulously giggly, Brother Phap Huu and Jo Confino a spiritual mentor and journalist. Listen to an episode or two, you won't be disappointed (plumvillage.org).

Finally, I really like the podcast **Upstream**, an American bi-monthly 'In Conversation' series that explores a wide variety of economic themes from an anti-capitalist perspective. Through a mixture of heartfelt stories, expert interviews, and rich sound design, it invites you to unlearn everything you thought you knew about economics and imagine what a better world could look like! (upstreampodcast.org)

All of them food for thought and a real treat for your ears.
