Dear Friends,

February is a busy time in the church this year. Candlemas always falls on the closest Sunday to 2 February and so is on the fourth. With Easter being early this year Lent begins on 14 February with Ash Wednesday.

Candlemas is traditionally when people would bring their candles for the year to church to be blessed, and for some it marks the end of Christmas. It replaced the Gaelic festival of Imbolc which falls halfway between the winter solstice and the spring equinox, and marked the beginning of spring. Perhaps this is why snowdrops, those harbingers of spring, are also known as Candlemas flowers. It also falls 40 days after we celebrate the birth of Jesus, recalling Joseph and Mary, taking the infant Jesus to the temple to meet their religious rulers of the time, and the reactions of both Anna, (an elderly woman who lived in the temple), and Simeon, who was waiting to see the Messiah and recognised Jesus as the one who had been promised. Simeon called Jesus, 'a light to reveal God to all nations'.

Accordingly this day was made into a feast of

candles. The warm candlelight is meant to be a tangible reminder of that greater light which, for and beyond all time, radiates from Jesus. We ourselves are reminded of the need to be prepared to burn brightly ourselves in the midst of this dark world with the light of Christ.



Green Energy Project Update

The Village Hall committee would like to report that the Village Hall Green Energy Project will now have sufficient funds to press ahead with the installation of solar panels and EV charging points in the Spring!! This is all thanks to the wonderful folk of Ashton Keynes and surrounding areas who have supported our events or dug deep into their pockets, donating a total of £2800 either on the JustGiving website or via other means. Donations are still welcome on www.justgiving.com - search for "AshtonKeynesVillageSolar"

This really is wonderful and is doing our bit to cut carbon emissions and so hopefully keep our little corner of the world as environmentally diverse and beautiful as it is. Without these donations we wouldn't be able to go ahead.

Clearly the work isn't over for us as we now try to get the project underway, but the fundraising is almost complete aside from an application to HMRC for a voucher towards the EV charging points and a couple of local grant applications.

The Parish Council is pleased to welcome Graham Carter who was co-opted at the December meeting. There is still one vacancy to be filled so please get in touch if you are interested or have any questions.

Can I apply for Co-option?

To join a local council you must be:

- A UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland; or be a citizen of another Member State of the European Union
- At least 18 years old
- An elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant); or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary.

Footpaths

The Parish Council wishes to express thanks to the **Cullimore Group** who have been carrying out works to footpaths to ensure that they are clear for use. This includes on the Thames Path towards Lower Mill where the footpath was being eroded due to fallen trees.

Thanks are also expressed to the landowner responsible for footpath 41, the footpath is now clear to walk along the entire length.

A reminder that walkers should stick to footpaths and not roam on private land. Maps are available showing where the footpaths are, any queries can be directed to the Parish Council.

Cycling is forbidden on footpaths, please leave footpaths for walkers and those using mobility aids.

Playing Fields

Phase One of the new play equipment project is now complete. Special thanks are expressed to Martin Young, Sam Crawford and the many volunteers who have made this possible.

Precept 2024/25

The Council agreed a budget of £40,194.00 for 2024/25. This would be an increase of 10.63% on the precept. The Council agreed to raise the precept by 5.8% to £38,173.00 and use general reserves to make up the shortfall.

Damaged Road Signs

The recent storms have damaged many road signs, this is a widespread issue. If you see a sign that is damaged, please do report it using MyWilts online reporting.

MyWilts Online Reporting

The Parish Council would like to highlight Wiltshire Councils online reporting. This can be used to report a number of issues from Abandoned Vehicles to Potholes.

This is the best way of reporting problems and it works. You can access the online report via the Parish Council website www.akpc.org.uk or by visiting: www.wiltshire.gov.uk/mywiltshire-online-reporting once you have submitted your report you will be given a unique number which you can use to keep track of any progress.


Dunkertons Cider House, Cheltenham, 10 February, from about 4pm onwards.




Starring Jennifer Saunders, Judi Dench, Sally Gill, David Bradley, Russell Tovey and Derek Jacobi

"If we don't go mad once in a while, there's no hope" – Rachel Joyce (the author of the book)

Based on Alan Bennett's play, Allelujah is a warm and deeply moving story about old age. When the geriatric ward in a small Yorkshire hospital is threatened with closure, the hospital decides to fight back by galvanizing the local community: they invite a news crew to film their preparations for a concert in honour of the hospital's most distinguished nurse. What could go wrong? Allelujah celebrates the spirit of the elderly patients whilst paying tribute to the deep humanity of the medical staff battling with limited resources

and ever-growing demand.

Allelujah is a film where you don't realise there's going to be a twist all, never mind one so vicious. Set in a small, crumbling hospital earmarked for closure, and which mostly deals with geriatric patients, Allelujah starts out as a classic Little Guy v Government Machine story – but!

He's reluctantly pulled back into the world of detection by his ever-persistent friend, Ariadne Oliver (Tina Fey), who persuades him to attend a Hallowe'en party hosted by enigmatic former opera singer Rowena Drake (Kelly Reilly). The pièce de résistance of the party is a séance led by the mesmerizing Michelle Yeoh, who oozes confidence and charm even as Poirot attempts to discredit her.

In Forest School with Mrs Willis, Class 3 have spent time learning about the make-up of a bulb and how they have skins. We classified a variety of bulbs and compared the similarities and differences. The children were really engaged and enjoyed being hands on. The children have layered planters with grape hyacinth, daffodils and tulip bulbs. It will be lovely to see these in bloom in Spring.

Year 4

We took the children to the Forest of Dean on a cold Thursday morning and the children did not hesitate to get stuck straight in to the activities - beginning with the making of the beds! There were some unique approaches to getting bedding on duvets but they were determined and showed excellent team work to get this completed. This determination and team work continued for the entirety of the stay from climbing up the new high ropes course, completing team challenges in low ropes, crate stacking and orienteering, they battled through the cold weather and kept smiling throughout. It was a delight to take them away and watch them thrive in a completely different environment to the classroom.

Year 5

In Year 5 we have been learning all about Ernest Shackleton and his crew onboard the Endurance and their incredible story of survival. We've been reading the book Shackleton's journey. We started off using our inference skills to work out the theme of the book.

This has led us to learn all about the continent of Antarctica and the scientific stations down there.

Year 6

Class 6 have been learning all about climate change and how we can all work as a team to reduce our own carbon footprints to help the environment. We have investigated how more economically developed countries contribute more to the climate crisis but also

have more money to spend on pursuing new green initiatives such as electric cars and solar panels. We learnt about food miles and the distances food has to travel from where it is produced to where it is sold. We used atlases and a food miles calculator to investigate the distances some of our favourite foods have to travel. We discussed the importance of growing our own produce and supporting local farmers.

In one of our Forest School sessions this term, Class 6 helped support the local community by planting bluebells at Bradstone Field to help the community to create their own bluebell wood for many years to come. The children thoroughly enjoyed it and were a real credit to themselves and the school.



Candlemas Festival

Candlemas festival is 2 February; 40 days after Christmas. Christians remember how Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the temple to thank God for his arrival. As Mary and Joseph presented Jesus, Simeon the priest recognised Jesus as the Messiah, God's promised one and he described Jesus as "a light to reveal God to the nations". Because of this association with light, people used to bring candles to church for them to be blessed and they'd be used at home over the



coming year.

The Stone Age didn't end because they ran out of stones.

I find myself being asked a lot of questions around the climate crisis, and I am delighted that Christiana Figures (Executive Secretary, UN Framework Convention on Climate Change 2010-2016) has put together considered, informed and brilliant answers to some of the most common and difficult ones.

Here are a few questions people often ask.

Q - "What about China? Let them sort out their emissions first."

- A There is a decarbonisation race going on right now between China, the US and Europe. The race is to get to a decarbonised economy ASAP which is where we need to be in the 21st Century. China is pretty much winning that race at the moment (due mainly to improving their air quality, which is an urgent priority for them)
- A China is the world's largest investor in solar, wind and battery technology. It has more electric busses than the rest of the world combined and the best and fastest charging infrastructure in the world.
- A China realises it can no longer compete on cheap labour and cheap products. They are investing heavily in green tech and will secure their competitive edge in the near future with low or no carbon products and services.

Q - "How can we afford the transition to a green economy during a cost of living crisis, where's the money going to come from?"

A - There's plenty of money around, it's just concentrated in too few hands. The global community subsidises fossil fuels to the tune of 7 trillion dollars per year! Maybe some of that could be redirected towards a green transition?



- A Wind and solar are now the cheapest form of new power in over 150 countries.
- A It's cheaper not to waste food, It's cheaper not to waste energy, it's cheaper not to waste any resources.

Q - "So you want to electrify everything, every single vehicle? Do you know cobalt is mined by children in unethical conditions? Plus we cannot properly recycle batteries yet."

- A It is true that there are rare earth materials in lithium batteries. Cobalt is difficult to mine, and there are absolutely unacceptable working conditions in the supply chain. That obviously has to change!
- A It's not actually about cobalt, it's about poverty, the reason children are mining cobalt is because they don't have any other options. Tackling poverty and climate change go hand in hand.
- A Innovation in batteries and electric vehicles has been remarkable over the last few years. The innovation and money that is pouring into this area means that the technology is advancing rapidly.

I hope those answers help. We are super lucky to be alive at this moment in time. We are the generation that have all the solutions to protect our beautiful planet. My feeling is that the more we are truly connected to Mother Earth, the more positive our outlook and the more fulfilled and joyous our lives can be. Get the positive stories out there. These are exciting times.


